

TAFT, KEFAUVER

BROMZE MEDAL

BY CPL MIKE WHEN AN ATTACK BY 'LOVE" COM-PANY WAS STOPPED AFTER SIX HOURS OF PUSHING, KIM HO WON, 24. A COR-PORAL IN THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA AR-MY, LEFT HIS JAMMED MACHINEGUN TO BREAK UP THE ENEMY'S RESISTANCE.

THE ATTACK, BEGUN AT EIGHT IN THE MORNING, CONTINUED UNTIL THO THE MORNING, CONTINUED UNTIL THE AMER CANS SECURING THE PED-HELD HILL. KIM, AN ASSISTANT TO GUNNER OFL WILLIAM ANDRUS, GAVE COVER FIRE OVER THE HEADS OF THE SLOWLY ADVAN-CING AMERICANS. AT LAST, FURTHER ADVANCE SEEMED IMPOSSIBLE.

STILL FIRING HIS RIFLE CONTINUED ALONG THE TRENCH TO THE ENEMY SMIPER'S POSITION AND BAYOL NETED HIM. THE ACTION SPOKE
