Assistant Defense Secretary Anne M. Rosenberg disclosed the plans to the House Armed Services Committee which is starting hearings on a broad new reserve program proposed by the defense department.

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#### GENERAL MACARTHUR ARRIVES IN WASHINGTON

General Douglas MacArthur arrived in Washington early Thursday and received a tumultuous welcome from a crowd of 12,000 people.

General MacArthur was greeted by President Truman's side Major General Henry Vaughn, as he stepped off his plane the "Betsey". Also on hand to greet the General were Generals Marshall, and Bradley.
