3. "NEUTRAL RUSSIA"- THE REDS ARE STILL SUBSORNLY ATTEMPTING TO GAIN UN REOPONITION OF RUSSIA AS A NEUTRAL NATION MEMBER OF BEHIND THE LINES INSPECTION TEAMS AFTER AN ARMISTICE IS SIGNED.

DURING THE LONG PERIOD OF PANMUNJOM ARMISTICE MEFTINGS A MAJORITY OF THE MINOR DETAILS FOR EFFECTING A MILITARY ARMISTICE IN KOREA HAVE BEEN WORKED. FOR THE MOST PART, THESE THREE VITALLY IMPORTANT PROBLEMS ALONE REMAIN.

## TANK-SHELTER

THE UNOFFICIAL ARMY MAGAZINE "ARMOR" SAYS TO AT TANKS COULD BE USED TO HOUSE SOLDIERS SAFELY DURLING AN ATOMIC ATTACK. THE MAGAZINE POINTED OUT THAT TANKS USED IN THE NEVADA ATOMIC TEST WERE ONLY MODERATELY DAMAGED BY THE EXPLOSIONS.

HEAVY TANKS, THE MAGAZINE SAID, COULD SURVIVE AN EXPLOSION AND CONTINUE FIGHTING. SOLDIERS TAKING REFUGE IN THE TANKS COULD BE MOVED QUICKLY TO NEW OFFENSIVE POSITIONS FOR A COUNTERATTACK.

BESIDES TANKS, THE MAGAZINE STATED, NO ADEQUATE PROTECTION HAS YET BEEN DEVISED FOR FOOT SOLDIERS. IN AN ATOMIC IMPACT AREA.

SENATOR JAMES DUFF OF PENNEL SYLVANIA SAID YESTERT AY THAT GENERAL EISENHOWER'S CHANGES OF SEING MOVIMATED FOR PRESIDENT ARE GAINING HEADWAY EVERYDAY. THE SENATOR SAYS WE DOES NOT SMARE THE FEARS OF OTHERS THAT THE GENERAL CAN NOT WIN UNLESS HE ACTIVE-LY SEEKS THE NOVIMATION.
