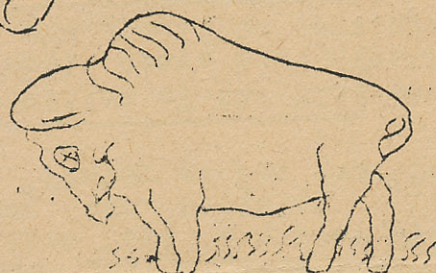
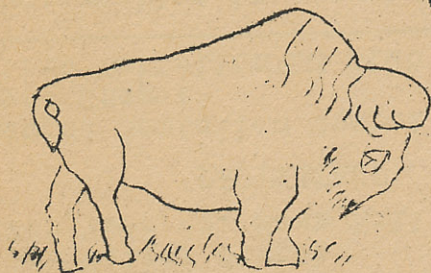

IN KOREA

Daring South Koreans blew up an enemy tunnel in the face of a large North Korean patrol Wednesday night on the eastern front. They killed approximately 44 Reds and destroyed a menacing enemy entrenchment.

The ROK raiders worked like commandos to gain entrance to the tunnel which the Reds had burrowed beneath Allied positions on "Anchor Hill," a key east front flanking position.

The South Korean soldiers planted 200 pounds of TNT in the tunnel and, when a large Communist patrol entered it, the ROKs exploded the TNT and the tunnel caved in on the entire patrol.

Then the ROKs fought their way back home.

On the western front, tanks, flame throwers, heavy artillery and low flying fighter-bombers supported a daring daylight raid that leveled a strong Red position.

France dropped her veteran foreign minister, Robert Schuman, from the cabinet yesterday and headed for a slowdown on European rearmament.

The new cabinet, with ex-Premier Georges Bidault as foreign minister, was announced by Premier Rene Mayer little more than 24 hours after Mayer won approval from the French Assembly.

(AFPS) Since the beginning of the Korean conflict, 850 tons of supplies, at an estimated cost of \$485,000, have been shipped by the American Red Cross to troops in Korea.

In its 1951-52 fiscal report, the Red Cross revealed that these supplies included 21,486,000 envelopes, 34,841,000 letterheads, 436,000 toothbrushes, as well as thousands of books, kit bags, combs, mirrors, razors, cards, pencils, and other needed items.

During the fiscal year, the report declared, more than 35,000 Red Cross volunteers served to a total of nearly 3,780,000 hours at United States military hospitals and installations at home and abroad, providing personal services for ill and able-bodied servicemen and women.

A total of 1,681,500 pints of blood for civilian, military, and veteran hospitals in the United States was collected during the year, the report stated. The Red Cross and cooperating blood banks received an additional 2,439,700 pints for shipment to Korea and for dried plasma defense reserves.

Servicemen, veterans, and their dependents received more than \$11,000,000 in financial assistance through Red Cross chapters.

year helped veterans with their claims for veterans benefits at the rate of 30,500 cases a month. As of June 30, 1952, the Red Cross held more than 1,385,000 powers of attorney for veterans who had applied for government benefits.

Each month during the fiscal year, 28,500 Red Cross volunteers served approximately 3,177,000 hours for patients in 156 VA hospitals. In military hospitals throughout the world, Red Cross workers planned more than 17,000 recreation events for patients each month and sponsored 85,000 movie showings during the year.

The Red Cross also helped more than 37,000 servicemen each month obtain emergency leave or emergency extension leave.
